2 perpetrate upon that State a new concept of public adminis-  
3 tration, namely that there were three branches in the  
4 government; and I said, well, I had examined the government  
5 of the State of Washington and I found out to my satisfac-  
6 tion that there were three branches of the government and  
7 that I did not find the University of Washington the  
8 judicial branch, nor did I find it in the legislative  
9 branch and, therefore, I could only conclude it was in  
10 the executive branch and, therefore, I assume that the  
11 institutions of higher learning and the public school  
12 people are in the executive branch.

13 I assume also, I think with some correctness,  
14 that is probably where the people would like to see them  
15 remain, unless you want to go the California route and  
16 create a fourth branch of the government, and this I advise  
17 you against. Now, if you do decide to permit the General  
18 Assembly to increase the Governor's budget, then you've  
19 got to give him corresponding authority to allot. I don't  
20 think you want to leave this to his inherent constitutional  
21 prerogatives, unless you are going to have as strong a
