2 are any more important than the Department of Health. They  
3 think they are, and they should think they are or they  
4 shouldn't be in the business, nor should Dr. Jenkins, as  
5 far as his institution is concerned. After all, these  
6 people are built-in pressure group leaders and they ought  
7 to be. It's their job to make their wants known as  
8 vigorously and as intelligently as possible, but Charles  
9 G. Daves, when he was Federal Budget Director, said it was  
10 the job of the Budget Director to relegate the department  
11 heads to the subordinate position to which they properly  
12 belong, and, by God, that's right.

13           When I went to the Budget Bureau, John was  
14 telling me about his experiences in New York, but when I  
15 went to the Federal Government of the ripe age of twenty-  
16 five, and I found myself calling up Jim Forestal on the  
17 telephone and telling him to get on his bicycle and get  
18 over to the Budget Bureau as fast as he could get there,  
19 I said to myself this is really the exercise of considerable
