We don't deal with these problems, you see, in terms of 1 administration either at the county level or the municipal level and, as we are presently constructed, the prob-3 lem looms larger at the county level than the municipal level. Anybody reading this would seem to think or 6 believe we haven't thought of the question does the trend, 7 which we see in the Cooper-Hughes Report, that the whole 8 State may get together and set standards, we don't seem 9 to have this reflected here because if we had as much 10 home rule as this would seem to show, we wouldn't have 11 any Statewide standards unless we are going to amend the 12 Constitution. So, I would think some reflection of that 13 trend might be here. 14 Then, in terms of specifics; this question No. 15 1, which has no alternative in it for retaining cities. 16 If you will notice, B and C both speak of some abolition. 17 There is very much more home rule for counties underlying 18 the thinking here than there is the existing constitu-19 tional home rule for cities. I am not trying to take the 20 position as to which should be the answer, but I think if 21
