MR. DONAHO: I know that, but the Constitution 1 gave the legislature the authority to adopt this act. 2 They could also repeal it, correct? 3 THE CHAIRMAN: There is no question about that. MR. DONAHO: All right, but the Constitution 5 should be broad enough to encompass all of these things 6 if the legislature through an act wants to take cognizance 7 8 of it. THE CHAIRMAN: But I think the legislature has 9 the authority, John, to do anything it wants with the 10 University of Maryland right now, because as I understand 11 it, the legislature has the supreme authority to pass 12 regulations which we call laws and the Maryland Constitution 13 merely negates these powers in certain areas. The Constitu 14 tion doesn't confer any power. 15 MR. DONAHO: The Constitution says that the 16 Governor shall present a complete plan. "Each budget shall 17 contain a complete plan of proposed expenditures and 18 estimated revenues for said fiscal year." 19 THE CHAIRMAN: That's right. 20 MR. DONAHO: If he doesn't have that stuff in it, 21
