the various alternatives; so that an ultimate Constitution Commission would deal with the problem.

We are going to turn here to question 5. It seems to me that there are other alternatives in that also, that is, whether to include a provision establishing general legislation in terms of city sizes and county sizes, on the one hand, or whether to leave this problem for the Legislature. That does not exhaust the possibilities at all.

There could be, with respect to the second one, some guidance for the Legislature. My own philosophy really runs along the idea of a broad Constitution which permits a very good deal of flexibility, but has in it a minimum of inflexibility. So, if someone says, a new development turned up in the space age, let us work that out within the institutions of the State, would be my philosophy, rather than saying we must amend the Constitution because we didn't think of that. That is why I think a broad Constitution would be appropriate, without getting to relative inflexibility.
