But what if they did not have DR. SENSENBAUGH: 1 this guarantee in the Constitution? I think they could come 2 up with a limited budget less than the formula called for. MR. SACHS: They could, of course. I don't question the fact they could, but they could also do what 5 they are doing now. 6 My question would be what would DR. SENSENBAUGH: 7 we do about it? 8 DR. JENKINS: Dr. Sensenbaugh, doesn't it protect 9 the schools against the Governor who -- and we've never 10 had such a Governor, but it is conceivable, who because of 11 differences with the State Department of Education --12 Or other reasons. DR. SENSENBAUGH: 13 DR. JENKINS: -- or other reasons might just 14 arbitrarily say, I'm going to reduce this amount? This 15 protects us against that, which has happened in some States 16 DR: SENSENBAUGH: It has happened in some States 17 THE CHAIRMAN: The point is you couldn't do it 18 now because the amount is set by statutory formula. 19 see a real reason for this kind of provision if the public 20 schools were dependent upon just a general fund appropriation 21
