1	to make things go. Yes, I think it would make a lot of
2	sense then, and Maryland at one time had that. It was sort
3	of that way at first and it moved through equalization and
4	now you say that is all out and it is all in the formula,
5	but having gotten away from general funded appropriations,
6	as such, to finance public schools, and having gotten into
7	statutory formula, I have some doubt that it is very
8	meaningful.
.9	By the same token, if it makes you feel more
10	comfortable, maybe it doesn't hurt anything, either.
11	MR. BOND: It's protection for one year. That's
12	the only thing I can see that the constitutional provision
13	gives them.
14	DR. SENSENBAUGH: That's important.
15	MR. DONAHO: Suppose the people decided to
16	reflect their wisdom through the election of a new Governor
17	and new legislature and wanted to make their will known?
18	There would be a year's delay.
