

1 confusion here. You are talking about another Board. These
2 are the Boards of Trustees and the Board of Regents, and
3 not the Board of Education.

4 DR. JENKINS: I may say this is the point of
5 contention between the colleges and the Budget Bureau, and
6 that we are hopeful in the future the Budget Bureau and
7 the Governor are going to give way to the recommendations of
8 the Advisory Council on Higher Education, because it is
9 conceivable, and there is nothing personal in what I am
10 saying, Mr. Perkins, but it is conceivable we could have
11 a Budget Director or Budget Bureau that is not particularly
12 sympathetic to higher education or other programs, and it
13 was the intent of the Curlette Commission that this
14 independent board of citizens would provide for, but granted,
15 of course, in the whole budgetary process, the Budget
16 Bureau has to have a hand in it.

17 THE CHAIRMAN: But that is not a constitutional
18 matter.

19 DR. JENKINS: No, it is not a constitutional
20 matter.

21 MR. PERKINS: Let me explain this. Now, the
