and this doesn't quite recognize it.

Now, in number eight, I think the problem which 2 we talked about doesn't quite emphasize the word complete 3 I think that should perhaps might be modified 4 or at least it needs an alternative, and the alternative 5 we are talking about is extensive because there are many 6 alternatives. If you're going to say the answer here is 7 yes or no, then your no is they do not have complete, but R what do they have? None? Well, I don't think we mean 9 that. It ought to be spelled out a little bit to indi-10 cate the degree of extensiveness. 11

In nine, I think the problem word is enumerate. I don't think the problem is with the word ripper. I think it is enumerated. We have to face with the Commission the question of whether enumeration is a limitation or whether we can find such broad language where we could leave flexibility and still set some standards, without trying to enumerate it. I don't know the answer to that, either.

That is really all I have to say.
