

1 MRS. FREEDLANDER: Not as before, but in the
2 draft stage?

3 THE CHAIRMAN: In the draft stage, yes. Again,
4 that is a formidable objective. I hope we can achieve it.
5 I see no reason why we can't do so because John Howard
6 and Dr. Loevy and I can get together and try to get that
7 accomplished with John Brooks giving us some aid and abet-
8 tance depending upon decisions made here today and leave
9 open for the next meeting.

10 MR. BROOKS: Did you say that meeting would be
11 here?

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes. Although this is substan-
13 tive and not merely preliminary, the next matter on the
14 agenda will be to refer back to our first report. You
15 will recall that that report was presented to the full
16 Commission and then came up for action by the full Com-
17 mission and was acted upon in large part. One matter
18 which was left dangling after concluding that the consti-
19 tution should give to the Legislature the power to provide
20 for creation of counties, new counties, cities or other
