particular localities affected. It would be actually Statewide in its effect all throughout the entire State.

MR. MELVIN: I don't understand that.

MRS. FREEDLANDER: That's not the way it reads.

THE CHAIRMAN: Let's go back to the language.

MILES: The Committee recommends that the new constitution retain the concept of having the creation of any basic unit of government being submitted to the voters of that new unit of government. The Committee feels this calls for a referendum, should be specifically required in the case of the creation of new counties or any changing of existing county lines or the existing boundaries of Baltimore City. I agree with the language.

THE CHAIRMAN: It is focusing the matter.

DR. LOEVY: I think the history may help you to understand. This Committee originally did not propose that there be any limitation on the right of the State Legislature to change boundaries or create new units of government. This continuation was added simply because of criticism from the full Commission where this was concerned. I think the Committee here is trying to go along
