units. There is an existing statute that says annexation we are just constitutionalizing an existing statute from
1919.

DEAN FORDHAM: If you put it in the constitution that rigidifies it and ties the hand of the Legislature in achieving the flexibility I think desirable.

MR. MELVIN: Aren't we only concerned at the time with whether or not we retain in the constitution article 13, Section 1? As I read the report and then refer to Article 13, it seems to me to apply only to boundaries.

THE CHAIRMAN: Where actually it refers only to boundary lines, though, would it not also include the creation of any new units because you have to define boundary lines insofar as the new unit is concerned. Wouldn't it be inclusive? It is true, however, it retains what is already in our existing constitution. Whereas we had formerly recommended or submitted our report without including restrictions by way of referendum as Mrs. Freedlander pointed out, the sense of the Commission was there should be the restrictions. Then we were directed to come
