unless the constitution grants the broadest powers to the counties to have their own charter form of government, the people will be subject to the absolute decision of that one individual.

I just wanted to make that point as we discuss it because I have been around enough to know there is a great deal of feeling on this question.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Loevy.

DR. LOEVY: Well, just to give you a little background of what led me to write this report was in beginning some summer; research for the Committee, I have done extensive research mostly oriented toward looking toward the present home rule situation in the State of Maryland. I felt, one, one point where the Committee had failed to have adequate force was on just what the exact home rule situation in Maryland is. That is the purpose of this report. As you can see, what I discovered was there really are three different types of home rule powers in the State, soon to be four.

I came to the conclusion as I was working on this, what started me in this direction, of course, was
