

1 comprehensive plan. I think it is still possible to be
2 considered under the approach the Committee originally
3 embarked upon. It would be one wherein the Legislature
4 is restricted still to passing local law, would still
5 have to pass general law, but there would be two tracks,
6 so to speak, down which it could go.

7 There would be a grant to the local political
8 subdivision which would have a system of mandatory home
9 rule of the powers that it is to have under either alter-
10 native discussed, either broad grant or your restricted
11 grant with definition. Under either system of what grant,
12 the Legislature be prohibited from passing the local
13 law applying only to one political subdivision, giving it
14 two alternatives. One, that it could pass law with regard
15 to classifications following a classification system as
16 discussed last time with a minimum of three political
17 subdivisions in a class and a maximum number of classes
18 such as five, in which case the Legislature could adopt
19 legislation for any one class, but realizing that wouldn't
20 necessarily fulfill all the alternatives, have another
