

1 pretty well encompass the various alternatives that would
2 be desirable to give the Legislature maximum flexibility
3 and still reject detailed local law they might otherwise
4 pass.

5 DR. BURDETTE: Baltimore City would have
6 to be associated in case of classification with at least
7 two other units of government. Those two units of
8 government could be either municipalities or some combina-
9 tion. Baltimore County and Montgomery County, for example,
10 with Baltimore City could be a classification.

11 MR. BROOKS: It could be a classification and
12 probably also include Montgomery and Prince Georges as
13 far as classification is concerned. But then the door
14 would be open for establishment of metropolitan or
15 regional government to include, for instance, Howard,
16 which would overlap the classification system. But in
17 that situation, you would always have the creation of an
18 independent authority to actually administer whatever the
19 law passed would establish.

20 In other words, this is a restricted area. You
21 wouldn't pass just any kind of local law, but wherever you
