

1 I am just throwing that out for what it is
2 worth, but it seems to me that carries out your idea
3 of mandatory home rule but at the same time leaves it
4 to the Legislature to determine precisely what those
5 powers are and also at the same time requires the Legis-
6 lature to give them these broad powers.

7 MR. MILES: How can you require them to give
8 it if you leave it up to them to give it?

9 MR. MELVIN: Because it at least includes these
10 powers that are specifically enumerated in Dr. Loevy's
11 alternate provision which, looking at it quickly, is cer-
12 tainly very broad.

13 I would like to reiterate my stand again as
14 far as this residual power theory. I just can't be con-
15 vinced that is the correct approach to this problem. It
16 certainly is a problem.
