powers in no way limit the broad grant of power.

another way to do it.

I also would recommend against that. My feeling is the purpose of a constitutional convention is
to strengthen the Legislature, get as much language out of
the constitution as possible, and have as many of these
decisions made by the Legislature as possible. We are
in the fortunate situation in Maryland of having that
situation be the status quo. This is why I raise the
question of whether we wish to fool with this at all.

Another way to adjust for the broad grant of power is to take the status quo and just change this present language and say that the charter counties can exercise any functions except those withdrawn and let it go at that.

THE CHAIRMAN: I think that fairly moves us into Dean Fordham's sphere because Dean Fordham was the drafter of the new so-called A.M.A. approach which was eventually adopted by the National Municipal League and incorporated into the model State constitution, which we have been more or less reviewing and studying.
