SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the legal voters of the town of Bishopville who have resided within its corporate limits six months preceding the election, of the age of twenty-one years and upwards, shall, on the first Monday in May, in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-four, and shall every two years thereafter on the first Monday in May, elect three persons who are owners of real estate in said town, to be commissioners of said town, to serve for two years from the date of their election and until their successors are elected and qualified, and the services rendered by the said commissioners shall be gratuitous and without pay.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the first election shall be held at the house used for elections in said town, or some other suitable place within said corporate limits, and the judges thereof shall be the justice or justices of the peace, and the constable in St. Martin's election district number five; the said judges shall appoint a clerk, and shall keep the polls open from two o'clock p. m. until five o'clock p. m., and shall conduct the said election in the same manner as an election for delegates to the General Assembly (except that registration shall not be deemed a necessary qualification for voters) as far as may be consistent with the provisions of this act; they shall carefully count, after closing of the polls, the ballots taken by them, and within three days after said election shall make a true and correct return of the same, under their hands and seals, to the clerk of the circuit court of Worcester county, who shall forthwith issue certificates of election to the three persons appearing from the said returns to have received the highest number of votes; and the said certificates shall be recorded among the records of proceedings of the said commissioners.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That the judges of election shall, before proceeding to hold an election, take an oath before some justice of the peace for Worcester county, to allow all persons to vote who are qualified under this act, and to allow none to vote unless so qualified.
