

SEC. 9. They shall meet at the almshouse on the last Saturday of each month, or oftener if necessary, and make, by a majority of votes of such as may be present, such rules and by-laws as they may think necessary for the direction, government and support of the almshouse, and for the maintenance and employment of all such persons as shall be taken under their care, and of all vagrants, beggars, vagabonds and other offenders that shall be committed thereto.

SEC. 10. They shall annually, on the first Monday of February, appoint an overseer of the almshouse, such appointment to take effect on the twenty-fifth day of March next ensuing, and shall, within ten days after such appointment, inform the overseer thereof.

SEC. 22. They shall, under the penalty of fifty dollars each, make out and render to the county commissioners, at their stated meeting of July of each year, a statement of their accounts and expenditures, with the necessary vouchers, for the preceding year closing with the last Saturday of June.

SEC. 23. They shall be entitled to two dollars per day for each day they shall attend to the discharge of their duties as trustees.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That all acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act be and the same are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
