

### Chapter 14.

AN ACT to provide additional employees for the General Assembly of Maryland for the session 1884, and to appropriate a sum of money to pay the same.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That there shall be appointed by the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Delegates, the following officers: One policeman, one keeper of the water closets, two keepers of the cloak rooms, one for the Senate and one for the House of Delegates, and one clerk to the Committee on Library, for the session of the General Assembly for eighteen hundred and eighty-four, provided that the appointment of clerk to the Library Committee, so to be named, shall be made on the nomination of the Committee on Library.

Additional  
officers.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the pay of the officers, to be appointed as above provided, shall be five dollars per day from the day upon which they are sworn in until the end of the session.

Per diem.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the sum of fifteen hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated, and the sum of two hundred and twenty-five dollars is hereby appropriated to pay James D. Powell, messenger to the printer and mail carrier of the senate; and the sum of one hundred and eighty dollars is hereby appropriated to pay John T. Tall, folder of the senate, for their services at the present session of the senate, the amounts specified being necessary to equalize their compensation with that of the officers of the same rank in the house of delegates.

Appropriation.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That the treasurer of the state shall, on the warrant of the comptroller of the treasury, disburse the money appropriated as aforesaid upon the order of the chairman of the Committee of Claims of the House of Delegates.

Who to dis-  
burse.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
