

Chapter 101.

AN ACT to authorize the Clerk of the Superior Court of Baltimore city to destroy certain registration and poll books.

Destroy registration lists.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the clerk of the superior court of Baltimore city be and he is hereby authorized and directed to destroy all registration lists and poll books now in his custody, except those made by the officers of registration in said city in pursuance of the act of eighteen hundred and eighty-two, entitled "An act to provide for the uniform registration of voters."

Chapter 102.

AN ACT to authorize and empower the Comptroller to apportion to Frederick county its usual and proper proportion of the State School Tax.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, by a special act of the general assembly, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-six, chapter three hundred and nineteen, section five, the board of county school commissioners of Frederick county is prohibited from incurring any indebtedness that cannot be paid out of the ordinary income of said board, during the fiscal year in which said debt is contracted; and whereas, for want of sufficient funds, and in obedience to said act, the said board of county school commissioners of Frederick county were unable to keep open the public schools of said county for seven and one half months for the year ending on the thirty-first day of December, eighteen hundred and eighty-three, and said Frederick county may therefore be debarred under the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-two, chapter three hundred and seventy-seven, section six, from receiving its usual
