one hundred and twenty-five and one hundred and twenty-eight, of chapter one hundred and eight, of the acts of assembly passed in eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, entitled "An act to add an additional article to the Code of Public Local Laws," to be entitled "Garrett county," be and the same are hereby repealed, amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Elect burgess.

Sec. 103. The qualified voters of said town shall, on the first Monday in April, in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-four, and every two years thereafter, elect a burgess, who shall serve for two years from the date of his election and until his successor is elected and qualified, and six commissioners, at the first election to be held under this charter, three of whom shall serve for one year from the date of their election, and three for the term of two years from the date of their election, their terms to be designated in their nominations and on the ballots by which they are elected, by the words "Short term" and "Long term" expressed thereon; and annually thereafter there shall be three commissioners elected, who shall serve for two years from the date of their election and qualification, and until their successors are elected and qualified, and said burgess shall be allowed an annual salary of fifty dollars, to be paid quarterly, for his services; and said commissioners shall each receive fifty cents for each attendance at the regular meetings of said burgess and commissioners, and said burgess and commissioners must be residents and qualified voters within the limits of the corporation.

Appoint judges of election and clerks.

SEC. 104. The corporate authorities of said town shall, at their regular meeting in the month of March, eighteen hundred and eighty-four, and at the same time in each year thereafter, for the purpose of holding said election, appoint three judges of election and two clerks; and it shall be the duty of said judges to open the polls at some convenient place in said town, to be designated by said burgess and commissioners, and the polls shall be kept open from ten o'clock a. m. until six o'clock p. m.; said judges shall qualify before the clerk of the circuit court for Garrett county, or as other judges of elections qualify, and shall certify the result of the elections held by them to the clerk of the circuit court for Garrett county.
