

Failure to pay cost of work. said owner or owners, or their agents, fail or refuse to pay the cost of such work within thirty day after the completion of the same, the said burgess and commissioners are hereby authorized to collect the same by law. The burgess and commissioners shall have power to pass any and all such ordinances necessary to carry into effect any of the provisions of this section.

Treasurer to give annual bond. SEC. 113. The burgess shall be treasurer of the corporation, and shall give an annual bond, in the penalty of two thousand five hundred dollars, with at least two sureties, who, at the time of going on said bond, shall make affidavit that they are each worth the amount of the penalty thereof, free of all incumbrances, conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties as treasurer; it shall be his duty to receive from the collector of said town all taxes collected by him, and all other moneys accruing, including fines, &c., and the same shall be paid out by him under the ordinances of said corporation; and he shall keep a regular account of such receipts and expenditures, and shall make quarterly reports thereof to said commissioners, or as often as they may require; and he shall, at the end of each year, furnish said corporation with a full and detailed statement, showing the financial condition of said town to that date, which statement shall be published by handbills, to be posted in not less than ten of the most public places in said town, and for a violation of any of said duties, his bond shall be put in suit; and any further duties to be imposed upon said burgess shall be defined by ordinances of said corporation, and said bond shall be recorded in the office of the clerk of the circuit court for Garrett county.

Keep account of receipts, &c.

Quorum. SEC. 118. The burgess and three commissioners shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and if the burgess be absent, four commissioners shall constitute such quorum.

Appoint collector of taxes and clerk. SEC. 119. The burgess and commissioners shall, at their regular meetings in May of each year, appoint a collector of taxes and a town clerk to serve for one year from the date of their appointment and qualification, and until their successors are elected and qualified, and said collector of taxes shall act as town constable, unless otherwise provided by section one hundred and twenty-eight; provided that the said burgess and commissioners shall have power to remove either
