the jurisdiction is granted by this act, together with all buildings and personal property, which is or may be hereafter within the bounds thereof, belonging to the United States, shall be exempted, exonerated and discharged from all state or county taxes, so long as the said lots or parcels of ground shall remain the property of the United States of America, for the purpose aforesaid.

Chapter 135.

AN ACT to authorize and empower the congregation of the Mission of Saint Vincent de Paul, in Germantown, a corporation created by an act of assembly of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, to purchase, acquire and hold real and personal estate within the State of Maryland, and to sell and convey such estate.

Whrreas, by an act of the general assembly of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, a corporation was created under the name of "The Congregation of the Mission of Saint Vincent de Paul, in Germantown," with power to purchase and hold real and personal estate, not exceeding in its clear yearly value the sum of five thousand dollars, for the purpose of erecting a church for said congregation, and also a dwelling house and a house of education; and whereas the said corporation is desirious of acquiring property in Frederick county, in the State of Maryland, for a church, a parsonage, a school house or school houses, a residence for the teachers of such school or schools, and for a burial lot; therefore—

Preamble.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the said corporation so created under an act of the general assembly of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and known as "The Congregation of the Mission of Saint Vincent de Paul, in
