

Chapter 137.

AN ACT to repeal section one hundred and ninety-three of article one of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Allegany county," sub-title "Birds," as said section was enacted by the act of assembly passed at the session of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, chapter four hundred and eight, and to re-enact said section with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section one hundred and ninety-three of article one of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Allegany county," sub-title "Birds," as said section was enacted by the act of assembly passed at the session of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, chapter four hundred and eight, be and is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Repealed and re-enacted.

193. *And be it enacted,* That no person within Allegany county shall, at any time, kill or destroy any blue bird, swallow, martin, finch, thrush, wren, oriole or woodpecker under the penalty of five dollars for each bird so killed or destroyed.

When unlawful to destroy, etc.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
