

for said county a license permitting the person named in such license to shoot or trap wild game in said county for one year from the day on which said license is issued, and that the person named therein, or the party procuring such license, shall pay to said clerk for such license the sum of four dollars, and fifty cents to the clerk for his fee for issuing said license, and any non-resident convicted before a justice of the peace of said county for gunning within the limits of said county without a license so to do, shall be fined twenty dollars for the first and for every subsequent offence; on failure to pay said fine the offender shall be confined in the county jail for ten days, provided that owners may extend privilege of killing said game upon his or her own land to whomsoever he may.

Fine for violation.

SEC. 5. *Be it further enacted,* That it shall not be lawful for any person to ship, or attempt to ship for the purpose of selling elsewhere, at any season of the year, any partridge, woodcock or rabbits that have been shot or trapped in said county, into any other county or state, without having first obtained from the circuit clerk of said county, a license permitting the person named therein to sell or ship the same beyond the limits of said county for one year from the day on which said license is issued, and that the person named therein, or the party procuring such license, shall pay to said clerk for such license the sum of one hundred dollars, and fifty cents to the clerk for his fee for issuing such license; any person violating the provisions of this section by selling or shipping game for sale, shall be fined the sum of five dollars for every partridge, woodcock or rabbit sold or shipped.

Must obtain license to ship: &c.

SEC. 6. *Be it further enacted,* That the possession by any person within the county of any of the birds or rabbits mentioned in the preceding sections of this act, at any time in which the shooting or trapping of the same is prohibited by said preceding sections, or the possession by any express or transportation company of any partridge, woodcock or rabbit at any time, shall be prima facie evidence of violation of this act.

What constitutes prima facie evidence.

SEC. 7. *Be it further enacted,* That any person or persons found trespassing upon any private property in this county, which shall have been posted or advertised, shall be liable to be arrested by any constable of the county, and shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof, before any justice

Fine for trespassing.
