

of the peace of said county, shall be fined the sum of five dollars, and on failure to pay said fine shall be confined in the county jail for a term of ten days.

SEC. 8. *Be it further enacted*, That the fines which may be collected by any justice of the peace of said county, under the provisions of this act, and the money paid to said clerk of the circuit court for licenses under the provisions of this act, be paid by said justice of the peace and the clerk to the county commissioners of said county, to be by them placed to the credit of the school fund for said county.

Fines—how disposed of.

SEC. 9. *Be it further enacted*, That it shall be the duty of the constable of the several election districts of the county aforesaid, to arrest any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this act, and take them before the nearest justice of the peace, to be dealt with as this act has heretofore directed.

Duty of constables.

SEC. 10. *And be it further enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Chapter 160.

AN ACT to adjust, prescribe and provide further security for the debts and obligations of the Susquehanna and Tide Water Canal Companies, to the State of Maryland.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the interest, payable by the Susquehanna Canal Company and by the Tide Water Canal Company to the State of Maryland, under the obligations of said respective companies, executed in pursuance of the provisions of the act of December session, eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, chapter four hundred and sixteen, entitled An act to insure the completion of the Susquehanna Canal, and of the Tide Water Canal, as modified by the act of December session, eighteen hundred and forty-three, chapter three hundred and sixty-three, entitled an act in aid of the Susquehanna Canal Company and of the Tide Water
