Chapter 188.

AN ACT to give and declare the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland to the bequest to the Rev. Theo. D. Mead, now in charge of the Williamsport and Clearspring Catholic Congregations, in Washington county, contained in the last will and testament of Fred C. Doyle, deceased, said money to be expended in Masses for the repose of the souls of Fred C. Doyle, his father and mother.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland be and the same is hereby given to the bequest of two hundred and fifty dollars to the Rev. Theo. D. Mead, now in charge of the Williamsport and Clearspring Catholic Congregations, in Washington county, Maryland, contained in the last will and testament of Fred C. Doyle, deceased, of said county; the said money to be expended in masses for the repose of the souls of Fred C. Doyle, his father and mother, said will having been admitted to probate on the twenty-ninth day of May, A. D., eighteen hundred and eighty-three, and recorded in the office of the register of wills of said county.
