tice of the peace in said counties, shall be fined not less than five nor more than twenty dollars, and on refusal to pay said fine shall be committed by such justice of the peace to the jail of the county until the same is paid.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted. That the fines collected under this act shall be paid by the officer collecting the same to the school commissioners of the county

so named, for school purposes.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That any constable of said county, or the sheriff thereof, who shall refuse to arrest any person violating any provision of this act, upon information of such offence, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof before the circuit court for said county, shall be fined not less than twenty nor more than fifty dollars, and shall forthwith be discharged from office.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That this act shall take

effect from the date of its passage.

Chapter 191.

AN ACT to give and declare the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland to the bequest to the Council of the Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Hagerstown, Washington county, contained in the last will and testament of Mrs. Ann A. Firey, deceased.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland be and the same is hereby given to the bequest of one thousand dollars to the Council of the Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Hagerstown, Washington county, Maryland, contained in the last will and testament of Mrs. Ann M. Firey, deceased, of said county, said will having been admitted to probate on the twelfth day of September, A. D. eighteen hundred and eighty-two, and recorded in the office of the register of wills of said county.
