Chapter 192.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact chapter three hundred and eighty-six of the acts of eighteen hundred and eighty, entitled "An act to repeal and re-enact chapter two hundred and ninety-four of acts of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, entitled 'An act to encourage the destruction of Hawks in Harford and Worcester counties."

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That chapter three hundred and eighty-six of the acts of eighteen hundred and eighty, entitled "An act to repeal and re-enact chapter two hundred and ninety-four of the acts of eighteen hun-re-enacted. dred and seventy-four, entitled 'An act to encourage the destruction of hawks in Harford and Worcester counties," be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted so as to read as follows:

Repealed and

Sec. 2. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That any person killing any hawks within the limits of Harford county shall be entitled hing hawks. to a bounty of fifty cents for each and every hawk killed.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That to obtain said bounty, it shall be necessary for the person killing a hawk or hawks, to produce the head or heads of the same before some justice of the peace for said Harford county, and at the same time make oath that the said hawk or hawks were killed within the limits of Harford county, and thereupon the said justice of the peace shall give a certificate of the production of said head or heads before him, and the taking of said oath, and it shall be the duty of the said justice to destroy the said head or heads, so as to prevent a second allowance for the same.

How to obtain

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That upon the production of the said justice's certificate, the commissioners of Harford county are hereby authorized and directed to levy upon the assessable property of said county a sum sufficient for the aforesaid county, for the use of the person or persons producing the same, and the collectors of tax shall collect and pay the same accordingly.
