

any one for the purpose of shipping to any place beyond the limits of Frederick county, or to send or carry beyond the limits of Frederick county, for the purpose of sale, barter or trade, any pheasants, partridges, squirrels or woodcock, shot, taken, snared or trapped in Frederick county.

Penalty for violation.

SEC. 4. *Be it enacted*, That for each pheasant, partridge, squirrel or woodcock, sold, bartered or traded, or attempted to be sold, bartered or traded, as set forth in section one of this act, a fine of ten dollars shall be imposed on violators thereof; a fine of twenty-five dollars shall be imposed for each and every violation of section two of this act; and a fine of fifty dollars for each violation of section three of this act.

What constitutes evidence.

SEC. 5. *Be it enacted*, That the possession by any person or corporation within Frederick county of any pheasant, partridge, squirrel or woodcock, shall be prima facie evidence that the same was shot, taken, trapped or snared in Frederick county.

The fact of transportation evidence.

SEC. 6. *Be it enacted*, That the transportation, or offer to transport any pheasants, partridges, squirrels or woodcock, shall be prima facie evidence that said pheasants, partridges, squirrels or woodcock, were transported or shipped, or offered for transportation or shipment for the purpose of sale.

Carrying pheasants, &c., evidence.

SEC. 7. *Be it enacted*, That the carrying of pheasants, partridges, squirrels or woodcock from door to door, shall be prima facie evidence that the same were being offered for sale.

Shall not refuse to testify.

SEC. 8. *Be it enacted*, That no person shall refuse to testify concerning any of the violations of this act, unless in such case when said person is on trial at the time, and said testimony shall not be used subsequently against the party so testifying.

Justices of the peace have jurisdiction.

SEC. 9. *Be it enacted*, That any justice of the peace of Frederick county shall have jurisdiction of any violations of this act, and any person offending against the provisions of this act, and being convicted thereof before any said justice of the peace, shall forfeit the fine or fines named in this act, the one-half of which shall go to the informer, and the balance to the county commissioners of Frederick county, for the use of Frederick county; and if the offender, on being convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of this act, shall fail to pay the fine imposed by virtue of this act, and the costs, he or they shall be committed to the common
