

alty of not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars for each offence; and on conviction, before a justice of the peace in and for said Worcester county, shall be committed to the county jail until such penalty be paid, but such imprisonment shall not exceed one day for each dollar of penalty imposed.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That no person or company shall capture or kill any wild fowl, by the use of nets set on their feeding grounds, under a penalty of not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars for each offence, or by imprisonment not to exceed fifty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the justice of the peace before whom it shall be tried.

The use of nets prohibited for catching.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the county commissioners of Worcester county shall have authority to offer and order paid such reward, not to exceed twenty-five dollars, as they shall deem proper, for evidence resulting in conviction for offenses committed against the provisions of this act, and all other statutes now in force, or that may be hereafter enacted, relating to the preservation and capture of game and wild fowl in Worcester county.

Chapter 214.

AN ACT to authorize the County Commissioners of Charles county to pay James F. Mathews, late State's Attorney of said county, such additional compensation as in their judgment may be proper, for professional services rendered to the committee of the grand jury of said county in its investigation of the books and accounts of the County Commissioners of Charles county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the county commissioners of Charles county be and they are hereby authorized to pay to James F. Mathews, late state's attorney of said
