

shall cross any travelled public road or street, and be kept ringing until it shall have crossed the said road or street; or a steam whistle shall be attached to each locomotive engine and sounded at least one thousand feet from the place where said railroad shall cross any road or street, except in the cities, and be sounded at intervals until it shall have crossed such road or street, under the penalty of one hundred dollars for the neglect of the provisions of this section, to be sued for before any justice of the peace of the election district in which such neglect may happen, in ten days after such penalty was incurred, one-half thereof to go to the informer, and the other half to the county in which such neglect may happen; and said company shall also be liable for all damages which shall be sustained by any person by reason of such neglect, and all penalties imposed by this act may be sued for in the name of the state; and if such penalty shall be for a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars, then such suits may be brought before a justice of the peace, and may be commenced by serving a summons on any directors or agents of said company.

SEC. 3 *And be it enacted*, That there shall be a general meeting of the stockholders of said corporation on the third Monday of January, in each and every year, for the purpose of choosing, by ballot or otherwise, fifteen members of said corporation to be directors, to manage the affairs thereof for twelve months, and until successors shall be chosen; and in all meetings every stockholder shall be entitled to give, in person or by proxy, one vote for each share of capital stock standing in his, her or their names on books of said corporation.
