SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That the male citizens of Girdle-Tree of the age of twenty-one years or upwards, who have resided in said town for six months next preceding the election, shall, on the first Monday in June annually, elect five freeholders, who have resided in said town for six months next preceding

said election, as commissioners of Girdle-Tree.

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That all elections shall be held and conducted as shall from time to time be directed by the laws of said corporation not inconsistent with this act.

Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners shall, at their first meeting after an election, elect one of their number president of the board, who shall preside at their meetings and preserve order and enforce the provisions of this charter and the ordi-

nances of said corporation.

SEC. 6. And be it enacted, That in case any of said commissioners shall die, resign, remove from said town, or be otherwise disqualified during the year for which they were elected, the remaining commissioners shall fill the vacancy so caused by electing a citizen of Girdle-Tree, qualified as aforementioned, for the bal-

ance of said unexpired term.

SEC. 7. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners shall meet from time to time, as occasion may require, not less than once in every two months, and may appoint a clerk, assign his duties and fix his com-

pensation as they may think proper.

SEC. 8. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners may make all such by-laws and ordinances not contrary to law as they may deem expedient for the comfort, health, convenience and prosperity of said town and its inhabitants, for the prevention and removal of nuisances, preservation of health and sup-

pression of vice and immorality in said town.

SEC. 9. And be it enacted, That all ordinances passed by said commissioners shall be entered into a book kept for that purpose, by the clerk, which book shall be open at all times to the inspection of any person interested, and copies of said ordinances shall be posted up in the most public places in said town, that the same may be generally known.
