

SEC. 10. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners shall have power to levy annually upon all the property in said town, subject to state and county taxation, a tax not to exceed twenty cents on the one hundred dollars, to defray the expenses of said corporation, and the collector appointed by them to collect the same, and pay same over to the commissioners, shall have the same power of distraint as a collector of county taxes; and the said commissioners shall fix the term of office, responsibility, and compensation of said collector and for the purpose of assessment may appoint two citizens of said town to assess all property in said town, after having been sworn thereto.

SEC. 11. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners may appoint annually a bailiff for said town, who shall perform such duties as may be required of him by said commissioners, and preserve peace and good order in said town; and for that purpose he shall have all the powers of a constable.

Appoint bailiff.

SEC. 12. *And be it enacted*, That they may lay a tax on all dogs kept in said town, and may collect the same as other taxes; or in default of payment have said dogs killed.

Dog tax.

SEC. 13. *And be it enacted*, That all fines and forfeitures under the ordinances of the said corporation, shall be recoverable before the president of the board of commissioners, or any justice of the peace in and for Worcester county, as small debts are recoverable.

Fines—how recoverable.

SEC. 14. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
