wise, to be used in the erection or furnishing of said building; provided, that the public ground not occupied by said building shall be used only for public

purposes.

How governed.

How to vote.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the said trustees and managers, in the use of said property, shall be governed by and subject to the control and wishes of the said persons so subscribing and contributing to the erection of said building; and such persons may fill vacancies in said board of trustees and managers, or remove any one or all of them, and substitute others in their stead; and in deciding such questions each subscriber shall be entitled to one vote for each and every twenty-five dollars paid by him, and a majority of the vote thus ascertained shall be considered and held as the act of all; but no contract or action on the part of said trustees or managers shall be effective or binding unless three concur therein, and the acts of any three or more of them shall be held and treated as the act of all of them.

Commissioners authorized to transfer, &c. SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That the county commissioners of Caroline county, and the commissioners of Denton, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to transfer, release and grant any and all interests and rights respectively that they may have in the same property to the said trustees and managers.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That this act shall take

effect from the date of its passage.

Chapter 270.

AN ACT regulating the sale of Intoxicating Liquors in Wicomico county.

Unlawful, except as provided. Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, by himself or themselves, his or their agent or servant, to sell intoxicating liquors in Wicomico county, except as hereinafter provided.
