

Make out assessment of real and personal property.

Commissioners may levy.

SEC. 46. The clerk of the county commissioners is hereby authorized and required, under the penalty of one hundred dollars, to be recovered on presentment or indictment in the circuit court of Kent county, to make out an assessment of all the real and personal property within the limits of said town (bank stocks, bonds, notes and other evidences of debt excepted), and the names of the persons assessed therewith, and to furnish the same to the commissioners of said town between the tenth day of July and the tenth day of August in each year; and the said commissioners may levy on the property so assessed such sum of money as they may deem necessary, not exceeding thirty-five cents in the hundred dollars in any one year, and may appoint and qualify a person to collect the same; and if the collector of the county taxes for the election or other district in which Chestertown is situated, shall be appointed, it shall not be lawful for him to decline receiving and acting upon said appointment, or to refuse to execute his bonds for the performance of said duty as provided in section forty-seven of the said Code of Public Local Laws, title "Kent county," subtitle "Chestertown."

Effective.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Chapter 39.

AN ACT to establish a Mining School in the County of Allegany, in connection with the Public Free School system of the State of Maryland.

Free evening schools.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That free evening schools shall be opened in the county of Allegany for the studies of mining and mechanical knowledge, and all necessary studies preparatory thereto.

Provide teachers.

SEC. 2. *Be it enacted*, That the school commissioners of said county be authorized to provide, from the now existing day schools, such teachers as may be
