Chapter 292.

AN ACT to authorize certain officials to commit destitute children to the St. Vincent's Infant Asylum of the city of Baltimore.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That any justice of the peace or the trustees of the poor of said city may commit to the Saint Vincent's Infant Asylum of the city of Baltimore, foundlings, and all children who may be destitute or suffering for want of support, either as orphan children or because of the extreme indigence or vagrancy or bad habits or neglect of parents, or who may be found begging about the streets of said city, or who may be the children of beggars; provided, however, that such children shall be under the age of six years when so committed, and that the commit-
