SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That all the children who shall be committed as aforesaid shall remain subject to the power and control of the officers and the directors of the said asylum, and may be bound or apprenticed or otherwise disposed of by said officers and directors as fully and in the same manner as is provided for the foundlings and infant orphan children in said asylum by the act of the general assembly of eighteen hundred and sixty-two, chapter ninety-three, entitled "An act to authorize the Saint Vincent's Infant Asylum of the city of Baltimore to bind out and control the destitute children under their care."

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

AN ACT to repeal sections two hundred and ninety-eight, three hundred and one, three hundred and two, three hundred and three, three hundred and six and three hundred and seven of article ninety-three of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Testamentary Law," sub-title "Wills," and to re-enact certain sections in lieu of sections two hundred and ninety-eight, three hundred and one, three hundred and two, three hundred and six and three hundred and seven of the said article.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That sections two hundred and ninety-eight, three hundred and one, three hundred and two, three hundred and three, three hundred and six and three hundred and seven of article ninety-three of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Testamentary law," sub-title "Wills," be and the same are hereby repealed, and that sections two hundred and
