

Chapter 301.

AN ACT to revive and create the Woodland Bridge Company, with all the rights, privileges and powers conferred upon it by chapter eighty-five of the acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at January session, in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-four, entitled "An act to incorporate a company to erect a bridge over the Patuxent river, between Anne Arundel and Prince George's counties," amended by chapter two hundred and ninety-eight of the acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January session, in the year eighteen hundred and seventy-six, entitled "An act to repeal, amend and re-enact section four of the acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January session, in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-four, chapter eighty-five, entitled 'An act to incorporate a company to erect a bridge over the Patuxent river, between Anne Arundel and Prince George's counties.'"

WHEREAS the Woodland Bridge Company, incorporated by an act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January session, in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-four, chapter eighty-five, entitled "An act to incorporate a company to erect a bridge over the Patuxent river, between Anne Arundel and Prince George's counties," did not organize on or before the tenth day of April next ensuing the passage of said act, as required by the provisions of said act, and William B. Hill, by virtue of the authority conferred on him by said act, on said defalcation of organization of the Woodland Bridge Company, built and maintained the bridge, causeways and roads authorized in said act; and whereas, owing to the destruction of the said bridge by the recent floods, the said William B. Hill is willing to sell the rights, privileges and property he now has in said bridge, causeways and roads, to the Woodland Bridge Company, to be revived by this act, the Patuxent river
