

Telegraph lines
 SEC. 24, CLASS 11. For constructing, owning or operating telegraph or telephone lines in this state, where the principal office of said corporation is located in this state.

New section added.
 SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That a new section be and is hereby added to said above described act, to follow section one hundred and thirty-six, and to be numbered one hundred and thirty-six A, and to read as follows:

 SEC. 136A. The provisions of the preceding sections, numbered one hundred and twenty-seven to one hundred and thirty-six inclusive, in relation to telegraph companies, shall likewise apply to and have full force and effect in respect to telephone companies created under the provisions of this act.

Chapter 361.

AN ACT to provide for the purchase or erection of water-works in the town of Frostburg, in Allegany county, and to authorize the Mayor and Councilmen of said town to issue bonds to pay the cost thereof.

Water bonds.
 SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That for the purpose of furnishing the inhabitants of the town of Frostburg, in Allegany county, with an adequate supply of good water, the mayor and councilmen of said town are hereby authorized and empowered to issue coupon bonds of said town to an amount not exceeding thirty-five thousand dollars, which said bonds shall be signed by the mayor and clerk of said town and attested with the corporate seal thereof, and shall be denominated "Frostburg water bonds," and bear interest not exceeding six per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually, to be issued in denominations not exceeding five hundred dollars, and to be payable at a time not exceeding thirty years
