

Chapter 362.

AN ACT to divide Election District number seven, or Cambridge, in Dorchester county, into two election precincts, to be designated as East Cambridge, or First Precinct, and West Cambridge, or Second Precinct.

Election district divided.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That election district number seven, or Cambridge, in Dorchester county, be and is hereby divided into two polling places or precincts, to be known and designated as East Cambridge, or first precinct, and West Cambridge, or second precinct.

Dividing line.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That said election district number seven, or Cambridge, be divided by a line commencing at the centre of the outer end of Thomas' wharf, thence running with the centre of High street to Poplar street, thence with the centre of Poplar street to Race street, thence with the centre of Race street to the town limits, thence with the centre of the County road to Maple Dam bridge, thence with the County road to Lot's lane, thence with Lot's lane to the limits of Cambridge district, and that all that part of said election district number seven, or Cambridge, lying to the east of said line, shall be known as east Cambridge, or first precinct, and the polling place thereof shall be at the court house; and all that part of said election district number seven, or Cambridge, lying west of said line, shall be known as west Cambridge, or second precinct; the polling place thereof shall be on Race street, between Muir and Washington streets, and in such house therein as the proper authorities may designate.

Polling places.

Appoint assistant registrar.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the governor is hereby authorized to appoint an assistant registrar of voters for said election district number seven, or Cambridge, to serve for one term, who shall assist the registrar of said district in making out the transfers and books of registration and poll-books for said precincts, and that said transfers for the first year shall be made either upon the application of the voter or the personal knowledge of the registrar, as to the voter's residence, and all residents of said precincts shall vote within their respective precincts; but the
