other officers, or either of them, from among themselves or other inhabitants of said town.

SEC. 30. And be it enacted, That the commissioners of Denton may, in their discretion, exempt and release from assessment or taxation any or all ma- Exempt plant. chinery, plant and property used in manufacturing for a period not exceeding five years, by agreement or otherwise.

Sec. 31. And be it enacted, That the interests and rights of the said corporation and the members of Temple Lodge, No. 1-8, A. F. and A. M., now held in the market house and Masonic hall, shall remain in them as heretofore, or be disposed of and released by them as has been or may hereafter be provided by law.

Interest and right of Temple Lodge.

Sec. 32. And be it enacted, That the county commissioners for Caroline county are hereby authorized and directed to pay to the commissioners of Denton, annually, not less than fifty dollars nor more than two hundred dollars, as a consideration for their attention to the public property and grounds, and the improvement of the streets through said town used as public highways, and levy for the same like other county charges.

Chapter 368.

AN ACT to repeal and to re-enact with amendments section five hundred and seventy-seven of article four of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Jail."

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section five hundred and seventyseven of article four of the Code of Public Local pealed and re-Laws, title "City of Baltimore." sub-title "Joil" be Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Jail," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:
