

peace, to be dealt with according to the provisions of this act; and upon information being given under oath to any justice of the peace for Cecil county, of any violation of any of the provisions of this act, the said justice shall issue his warrant for the arrest of the offender or offenders, and the seizure of all sink boxes and vessels, decoys, tackle or other furniture belonging thereto, which warrant shall be directed to the special policeman or to the sheriff or any constable of Cecil county, or to one or more of those holding licenses, and constituted as officers to carry out the provisions of this act, and any one resisting an officer or other person authorized to make arrests or seizures under this act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon indictment and conviction in the circuit court for Cecil county, shall pay a fine of not less than fifty dollars, and not more than one hundred dollars, or be imprisoned in the county jail for not less than thirty days, nor more than sixty days, or be both fined and imprisoned in the discretion of the court.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That when fines are imposed for violations of this act, and the offender or offenders refuse to pay the same, then the special policeman or sheriff or constable may proceed at public sale, after giving three weeks' notice of the time and place of such sale by advertisement in one newspaper in said county, to dispose of the sink box or other craft, together with the decoys, tackle and furniture belonging thereto, to the highest bidder for cash, and the proceeds of such sale, after deducting all legal expenses, shall be appropriated to the payment of said fine, and the residue, if any, shall be paid to the original owner.

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted*, That all fines imposed under this act, whether the same may be recovered by action for debt in the name of the state which process is hereby authorized, or secured by public sale as provided in section six of this act, shall be divided as follows, viz: One-half to the informer and the other half to the county commissioners of Cecil county for the use and benefit of said county; and all moneys accruing from the sale of licenses under this act, not exceeding two hundred dollars per annum, shall be paid over at the end of the gunning seasons to the special policeman appointed under this act.
