Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the comptroller be and he is hereby directed to draw his warrant upon the treasurer, for forty-four dollars and sixteen cents, to pay Henry C. Hutchens for money paid by him in error into the treasury of this state as collector aforesaid.

Chapter 399.

AN ACT to add additional sections to the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, chapter ninety, incorporating the town of New Market, in Frederick county.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the following sections be added to the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight Sections added. chapter ninety, incorporating the town of New Market, Frederick county, to follow section eighteen of said act, and to be styled section eighteen A. and section eighteen B., as follows:

SEC. 18 A. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners are hereby authorized and empowered to build and maintain a lock-up in which offenders may be confined, and to levy a tax sufficient to build and maintain said lock-up, on the assessable property of

said incorporated town of New Market.

SEC. 19. B. And be it enacted, That the authorities of said corporation may commit offenders against the ordinance of said corporation to the county jail, to be kept at the expense of the county for a term not exceeding thirty days, provided that all vagrants, vagabonds, beggars and other idle disorderly persons found loitering in said town, who follow no trade or occupation, and have no visible means of support, if apprehended under ordinance of said corporation, shall be committed only to the almshouse of Frederick county, there to be kept at hard labor for a term not exceeding three months, according to the term of commitment.
