

of eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, chapter four hundred and ten, three hundred dollars for each volume, or so much thereof as may be necessary.

MILITIA.

For the support of the militia of the state, to be expended under the supervision of the governor, under the provisions of the act of eighteen hundred and seventy, chapter one hundred and eighty-two, fifteen thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary; for the salary of the adjutant-general of the state, fifteen hundred dollars, to be paid out of the appropriation for the support of the militia, and the balance of said appropriation, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the maintenance of companies, battalions or regiments of state militia already organized in the various counties of the state and the city of Baltimore, and the additional sum of four hundred and fifty dollars is hereby appropriated for the Williamsport light infantry.

PENSIONS.

For the payment of pensions granted by the various acts and resolutions of the general assembly—to Mrs. Sarah Ann Watson, Mrs. Julia A. Dorsey and William Brown, during their natural lives, in accordance with the provisions of resolution sixty-three of eighteen hundred and forty-nine, chapter two hundred and twenty-eight of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, and chapter two hundred and sixty-nine of eighteen hundred and seventy—five hundred and twenty dollars.

For pensions granted.

SCHOOLS.

For the system of free public schools (white and colored) in the several counties and the city of Baltimore, and for the State Normal School and the State Board of Education, to be apportioned by the comptroller in accordance with the laws in such case made and provided, and the direction herein given, five hundred thousand dollars, or whatever sum may be paid into the treasury on account of the tax for public schools, also such other sum or sums as may be received to the credit of the free school fund from the tax on the circulation of banks, from the interest on stocks standing to
