

tants, with reference to the matters and things herein embraced; nothing, however, herein contained, shall be construed to prohibit a sale by such pharmacist and druggist in cases of extreme illness, when delay would be dangerous; any pharmacist and druggist, or physician, violating any provisions or requirement of this sub-section, shall be guilty of misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be fined in the sum of not less than fifty dollars nor more than three hundred dollars for every such offence, and shall stand committed until such fine or fines and the costs of prosecution are paid; in all cases, one-half of all fines to go to the informer, and the residue to the county board of school commissioners of said county, for the use of the public schools therein.

Chapter 55.

AN ACT directing the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, to appoint one additional Justice of the Peace for the third Legislative District of Baltimore city.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That upon the passage of this act, the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, shall appoint one additional justice of the peace for the third legislative district of Baltimore city.
