

Penalty.

landed or taken off, who shall knowingly permit any such wharf, pier or landing to be or to remain in an unsafe condition, or any steamboat or transportation company who shall land passengers at any such wharf, pier or landing shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and liable to a fine of not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, to be collected as other fines and forfeitures are collected, one-half to go to the informer.

Chapter 487.

AN ACT to incorporate the Annapolis and Bay Ridge Railroad Company.

Railroad incorporated.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Harry E. Loane, E. F. Steck, A. C. Haines, H. B. Ring, James H. Brown, John Ireland, James H. Vansant, A. W. Fletcher, H. D. Schmidt and Walter L. Virtue, and their successors, be and they are hereby constituted a body corporate, under the title of the Annapolis and Bay Ridge Railroad Company, and shall be capable of purchasing, holding, selling, leasing and conveying estates and property as natural persons; may have and use a common seal, which they may alter and renew at pleasure, sue and be sued, and have and enjoy all the powers, rights, privileges, franchises and immunities which any other corporation may have and exercise for the purposes of this act.

Capital stock.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the capital stock of said corporation shall be one hundred thousand dollars, divided into two thousand shares, of the par value of fifty dollars each, and shall be sold and paid for as may be determined by the said corporators hereunder, or a majority of them; and if any shares of stock remain unpaid for, after the payment thereof is requested, either in whole or in part, the same may be forfeited to the corporation and reissued or resold, as may be determined by the president and directors, if
