ditional sum as may be required to gradually retire and redeem such bonds until they shall have been redeemed; and said tax authorized by this act shall be collected as other taxes are collected in said county.

SEC. 5. And be it enacted, That the money raised by the issue and sale of such bonds under the provisions of this act, shall be exclusively appropriated and applied to the payment of the sums of money already borrowed by said county commissioners and applied to the building of bridges, and also used by them to subscribe for two-fifths of the stock of turnpikes in said county, for which the obligations of the county have been given, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum.

SEC. 6. And be it enacted, That this act shall take

effect from the date of its passage.

## Chapter 495.

AN ACT to refund to Thomas C. Maslin, late collector of State taxes of Kent county, forty dollars and thirty-eight cents, and to William F. Roeder, collector of State taxes of said county, sixteen dollars and thirty-six cents, heretofore by them paid erroneously into the Treasury of the State.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That on the warrant of comptroller, the treasurer of the state is hereby directed to pay to Thomas C. Maslin, late collector of Kent county, or his order, the sum of forty dollars and thirty cents, being the amount certified by the county commissioners of Kent county to have been allowed said Thomas C. Maslin on account of certain insolvences, removals and improper assessments in the years eighteen hundred and seventy-nine and eighteen hundred and eighty, and to William F. Roeder, collector of said county, or his order, sixteen dollars and thirty-six cents, certified as aforesaid to have been allowed to
