

byways and highways in their respective districts, and that upon the report of said sanitary officers of the conditions of any alley, byway or highway being prejudicial to the health of the neighborhood, it shall be the duty of said county commissioners to examine the same, and have made such repairs in the grading, paving and draining of such alley, byway or highway as may be necessary, taxing the property binding such alley one-half the cost of said improvements.

Duty of commissioners.

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted*, That it shall be unlawful for any person to keep a hog-pen or pig-pen within fifty feet of any dwelling-house, well or spring, the water of which may be used for drinking and cooking purposes, in the said Woodberry, Towsontown, Waverly, Canton, Clifton and Charles street extended, and their vicinities, under a penalty of not less than ten dollars, and the said sanitary officers shall immediately remove the same.

Location of hog pen.

Penalty.

SEC. 10. *And be it enacted*, That all fines and penalties under the provisions of this act shall be collected before a justice of the peace of Baltimore county in manner prescribed by section two of act of eighteen hundred and eighty-two.

Fines—how collected.

SEC. 11. *And be it enacted*, That all acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Inconsistencies repealed.

SEC. 12. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from its passage.
